#### **Work Experience:**

2004-Present: Alta Mira Recovery Center, Sausalito, CA.

Psychologist. As sole psychologist for the program, assess all inpatient clients, score and write all reports, give feedback to clients and their families; Primary Therapist; supervise MFT interns and PhD interns. Co-lead process group twice weekly; co-lead rounds on daily basis.

Cases completed in last year include one alleged murder case, three alleged attempted murder cases, two fitness cases, numerous alleged robbery cases, numerous alleged weapons cases, two alleged terrorism cases, and four cases involving ICE holds. Four of these cases have been publicized in the media.

Sole Neuropsychologist for the Defense in a Juvenile Murder case in Southern California. Tested defendant over period of several months; testified as expert witness on both Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and Adolescent Brain Development as it affected the defendant and therefore impacted the case. Trial was in April 2010. Verdict returned April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2010. Case publicized in numerous southern California media outlets.
